The end of an era

Dismayed staff are told the Caterham Marie Curie hospice is set to close in the spring

Marie Curie Cancer Care is restructuring its services in Surrey and its plans include the closure of the hospice in Harestone Drive, Caterham Valley in March 2009. The hospice closed its beds three years ago but since then the charity has funded four beds at the North Downs Hospital in Tupwood Lane for patients requiring end of life care in a hospital. The restructure means the closure of the four beds in North Downs hospital, but alternative provision will be available in St. Catherine's Hospice in Crawley.

Restructure of Marie Curie nursing care

(Continued from Page 1)

Currently, around half of all cancer deaths in the county occur in hospital but research by the Marie Curie Cancer Care charity shows most people in the UK would wish to die at home if they had a terminal illness. Earlier this year, the charity made a commitment to double the number of people being cared for at home at the end of life by Marie Curie Nursing staff.

As well as the closure of the Caterham Hospice, the charity is also reviewing the current Community Supportive Care Service and the Specialist Palliative Care team. It is currently talking with its staff and Surrey and Croydon Primary Care Trusts about its proposals and how best to support more patients and their

families in the future through the delivery of more home nursing care. Susan Munroe, Director of Nursing and Patient Services at Marie Curie said: "If we are able to invest more in the local Marie Curie Nursing Service we believe we will be much better placed to help more people achieve their wish to die at home."

The beds at North Downs Hospital closed last week and patients requiring inpatient palliative care will go to either St. Catherine's Hospice in Crawley. St. Christopher's Hospice in Sydenham or the Caterham Dene Hospital.

East Surrey MP, Peter Ainsworth, said: "I recognise that, as an independent charity, Marie Curie is perfectly free to make its own decisions; however, I believe that they need to do a great deal more to convince local cancer sufferers and families that their plans are in the best interests of our commu-

We're back in business!


Caterham traders and residents are hugely relieved that the roadworks on Church Hill have finished for the time being, bringing a welcome end to the traffic jams and chaos of the last few months. Andrew Browne, Chairman of the Caterham Valley Business Forum, said: "We want to ask everyone to come back down to the Valley to do their shopping now that the road is clear again. It took a lot of pressure and media cover-

age for us to get this result in time for the Christmas shopping period. Trade went down by 25% during the roadworks as shoppers avoided the town centre and went elsewhere. We understand the reasons why, but things are back to normal now."

The bad news is that there is still three weeks' worth of work to complete but it is hoped the roadworks will not resume until the end of January 2009.

Highways investigate the Mount Pleasant floods

Surrey Highways have been swift to take action, following the continued flooding of Caterham Valley since the recent 'big clean'. During the cleanup over 15 tons of silt, and 180,000 gallons of water was extracted from the systems. Chairman of the Transportation Select Surrey Committee at Council, David County Hodge, said: "Although the operation was highly successful it did not clear the problems in Croydon Road and Mount Pleasant Road where flooding still occurred after the clean-up operation.

"I brought this matter to the Highway Officers' attention and it was agreed to make arrangements for County Contractors 'Conways' to undertake a complete review of the drains and gullies and to use camera technology to check all the drains to en-

sure they were in good condition.

The formal report from Conways is expected to show that there is a 'fall' difficulty with the rainwater at the junction of Croydon Road and Mount Pleasant Road as it flows to the link on the opposite side of Croydon Road. As the gradient levels out at the bottom of Mount Pleasant Road, the flow of the water slows down, causing floodina.

"Once Conway's have com-

pleted their full report and Highway Officers have digested the full implications of the findings then I will arrange for a formal report to be brought to the Surrey County Council Local Committee at Tandridge when councillors can assess what needs to be done," explained Hodge.

The Caterham Independent will keep readers updated with the findings of the report and further progress in this matter.

Help keep Christmas crime free

Surrey Police is reminding everyone to be on their guard at this time of year as thieves target motorists and householders with the aim of relieving them of their precious goods.

Shoppers are urged not to leave their purchases on view in their cars. Thieves target car parks, particularly in the lead-up to Christmas, watching and waiting for people to offload parcels and bags in their cars before going off to do more shopping.

Shoppers are also reminded to be wary of pickpockets - and to keep purses and wallets secure and out of sight.

Opportunist thieves may also be tempted if they can see a pile of presents under a tree, so householders are advised not to leave those beautifully wrapped gifts on view to passers-by, and to always ensure doors and windows

are shut and secure when leaving the house, even if just popping out for a few minutes. The average burglary takes only five minutes to carry out from start to finish.

Even at home a few simple precautions can help ensure a happy Christmas for everyone except the villains! Police advice is never to leave car keys near an open window or even by the front door opportunist thieves have been known to steal people's car keys by hooking them out through the letterbox with a stick, and calmly driving away the family saloon parked outside the house.

Surrey Police Force Crime Reduction Advisor Jamie Robinson says: "It is important for people to be particularly vigilant at this time of year, both at home and while out shopping. And after Christmas it's worth remembering not to leave the empty boxes of high value presents such as TVs, X boxes, Wiis and iPods outside the house as these could also act as an invitation to burglars.'

I would like to start with positive news around Halloween patrols. The lead-up to the festival was quiet and on the night itself my team received 27 calls which is certainly quieter than last year. Thank you to those that were out Trick or Treating in Tandridge for entering into the spirit of the night, to the members of the community who contacted me to thank my team for their presence out there and my team for changing shifts and ensuring it was an evening that could be enjoyed by all.

You may have read recent reports about robberies in Caterham; I would like to reassure all of you this kind of crime is very unusual for Caterham and for Tandridge as a whole. This year in Tandridge, an area of 110 square miles, we have had just 11 personal robberies. This type of crime, along with all crime, we want to reduce further and my team are working with detectives to identify suspects. If you have any information at all then please call us or Crimestoppers if you wish to remain anonymous. You should have received your



Neighbourhood Policina through your door with the news in your area and details of future panel meetings. We have used these letters to launch Countrywatch in Tandridge and I would ask that you support this scheme which is about preventing and detecting crime to business and personal property in rural areas.

I would ask that everyone is alert to reports being received about bogus cold-callers operating in Tandridge and elsewhere claiming to either represent charities or even purporting to be Police or Fire Officers. These bogus callers are attempting to get residents to part with their money by offering advertising space in various publications or by asking for charitable donations. Services would not carry out such cold calling. If you have suspicions about anyone that comes to your or your neighbour's door then please call us.

Finally I would like to wish you all a very merry but safe Christmas and best wishes for the New Year.

New youth facilities for Caterham town centre

Surrey County Council has agreed terms in principle to secure local facilities in Godstone Road for youth services.

This will mean that some youngsters who need a bit more support and help will once again have a centre in Caterham. It is also hoped to provide a Youth Cafe on the same site, which will be a vibrant, safe and appropriate place that will welcome all young people in the town. Sally Marks, member for Caterham Valley, said; "I am delighted that after several false starts Surrey County Council will now be able to provide facilities for youth in the town centre. It has been very disappointing to me that following the closure of the previous site we have not been able to provide local facilities that meet

the needs of the local community. This has been due to some of the options we have considered, not being suitable due to such things as poor disabled access or affordability and value for money to taxpayers. I am hoping that, subject to planning consent being granted by Tandridge District Council and the fit out of the facilities, the service will be opening its doors in the first half of next vear.

Given that the provision of such services has remained a high priority to me and to many others, I am hopeful that any planning application for this site would be looked on favourably by the Planning committee at Tandridge District Council and am sure that the application will receive support from the Caterham Valley Dis-

Grassroots Grants supporting local communities

Surrey Community Foundation is delighted to have awarded £160,000 to 47 community groups. This is the total amount awarded so far from the three year Grassroots Grants programme, which aims to support small voluntary groups who are making a big difference to their local communities. Grassroots Grants is funded by the Office of the Third Sector (OTS) and administered nationally by the Community Development Foundation (CDF).

Surrey Community Foundation is managing Grassroots Grants for Surrey and has awarded over £90,000 this month alone to 26 local voluntary groups. This included a grant of £5,000 awarded to 1st Godstone Scout Group to fund a refit of their headquarters, which will provide a storage space for the club's equipment. The memories of a Caterham scout

Some readers may remember Les Hayley, now age 92 whose parents ran Hayleys stores in the Valley, where the HSBC bank now stands. He returned to Caterham recently to show his daughters where he grew up.

As a child he had been a Wolf Cub in the 1st Caterham Cub Pack, who were then based next to the Methodist Church in Coulsdon Road. He then became a Scout in the newly formed Valley Troop, now the 3rd Caterham. He was unable to come up and see the exhibition that was held earlier this year at the East Surrey Museum, or to attend the centenary of the 1st Caterham, but was interested in seeing some of the articles.

He was able to identify over half the people in a 1928 photo of the 1st Caterham at camp. He could also identify the leaders and some of the youngsters in a lorry at the 1930 Fire Brigade Carnival, and thinks it is a picture of him in a 1929 edition of the Scouter magazine, hanging onto the side of Warlingham Scout swimming pool - he still can't swim.

It was great fun talking to him, and I learnt a lot about Scouting



The Tandridge Team gets tough

Tandridge Safer Neighbourhood Team joined forces with partner agencies to carry out the largest operation in the area to crackdown on anti-social driving and dangerous vehicles.

The road safety initiative, which took place along the A22 at Whyteleafe on Wednesday, 26th November, was in response to concerns raised by the community at recent neighbourhood panel

Rose & Young - Chief **Executive of TDC's** response I refer to the letter from

Mark Lewis that appeared

in The Caterham Inde-

pendent in November, concerning the former Rose & Young site and other matters affecting Caterham. Mr Lewis alleges the Council has tolerated and kept quiet the fact the Rose & Young site is not eligible to pay business rates. Your readers may not appreciate that a central government body, the Valuation Office Agency (VOA), not the Council, is solely responsible for deciding which properties are liable for business rates. We collect the money due, but have no say in who is eligible or the amount they pay. In addition only 35% is kept by Tandridge. Accordingly, the Council had no control over the VOA's decision to remove the Rose & Young site from the rating list in 1997. To

imply the Council and its

councillors have been at

fault over this is wrong. However, I do sympathise with the strong views of Caterham traders and residents who feel aggrieved about this issue.

Despite the government's recent initiative to abolish empty rates relief, to try and help stimulate the development of empty property sites, this move does not affect the Rose & Young owner, as the property has no rating liability in the first place.

We asked the VOA to clarify the position and its response has been reported in your newspaper.

As the Rose & Young premises is privately owned, the Council's powers to force a redevelopment are limited. Compulsory purchase order (CPO) powers can only be exercised by public bodies when the owner of a site is found to be blocking the way to a regeneration or improvement scheme.

Ideally, a commercial development partner would come forward, willing to invest in a financially viable scheme to transform the Rose & Young site and help revitalise the Croydon

Compulsorily acquiring a private site without a viable commercial development to implement would be likely to incur substantial costs and risks and would result in Council taxpayers taking on a significant financial liability. Nevertheless the matter is being kept under review should a viable worked up proposal come forward and there remained a blockage to it being implemented.

Without these pre-conditions we cannot consider a CPO for the site with all the accompanying costs and uncertainties and the possibility the government would not confirm any such order should an objection be made.

We have had many meetings with the owners and prospective developers to discuss the site's development. These meetings have been carried out with a flexible approach to appropriate new uses, which are reflected in our planning policy for town centres. (Cont. on page 20)

Around the middle of November, I was asked if it was too late to scarify the lawn and give it an autumn feed. I feel it is and certainly by the time you read this article it will be.

The lawn needs time to recover from being dethatched and scarified and as growth is now more or less stopped such recovery will be more difficult. I would now be inclined to leave the lawn until the spring, then rake out the moss and dead grass, aerate and use a spring feed, thus encouraging new growth. Through the winter, try to keep off the grass, especially when it is wet as walking on it will compact the ground and restrict new growth later

Winter is a good time to plan and implement changes to the garden. If an established plot contains many perennials, they may have become overcrowded or straggly looking.

Tackle one area at a time and if possible lift everything out and ensure all weeds are removed. Dig over the ground, adding as much organic matter as possible, then replant either the complete clump, or healthy young sections from around the edge of each clump. A decent mulch around each area will assist in suppressing any remaining weeds. Try interspersing winter flowering cyclamen, pansies and primroses as most will flower through to spring giving colour through the dark months of winter.

Pots and patio containers which have been planted with summer flowers do not have to remain empty. Plant these up using small upright conifers, small skimmias or choisyas, trailing ivies and winter flowering heathers. Keep in mind that the heathers will require an ericaceous based compost.

Finally it is an ideal time to check plant stakes and supports for climbing plants. Many will have become damaged by the wind, overweight plants or simply rot. If this is so replacement is so much easier whilst the plants are relatively dormant.

Try to keep off very wet or frosty ground and enjoy the slightly different challenges that winter presents to the gardener. Oh, and by the way, a very happy Christmas.

Our newly adopted Core Planning strategy will greatly help in this.



Get fit to the core!

by Steve Robertson, Energy for Life

It's that time of year again when some of you will be thinking of your skiing holiday for Christmas. The rest of us still need to keep our training regime in tip top condition so for the benefit of all of us we will look at core strength and balance. Core strength refers to the strength and stability around your abdominal, lower back and hip muscles and as skiing incorporates a lot of twisting and rotating, it plays a critical part in controlling the movements on your skis. The stronger your core, the easier it will be to perform more challenging manoeuvres and maintain good form. It will also help reduce the risk of injury. Balance is also critical for skiers. Good balance will enable you to land tricks easier and crash less. Here are some examples of exercises from our training program at Energy for Life.

Russian Twist

• Lie on a stability ball with your feet on the floor, knees at right angles. The ball should be nestled around your shoulder blade area. Keep your abdominals pulled in to support your back and help engage your core.

Hold a weight

plate/medicine ball above your head and roll to the side until the tip of your shoulder is on the ball, and then repeat to the other side.

Stability Ball Bridge

- Support your weight with your toes on the ground and place your forearms on the ball, creating a bridge with your body. To increase the intensity, instead of using your forearms place your hands on the ball as though you were doing a push up.
- Draw in your abdominals towards your spine and hold this throughout the exercise for a specific time.



New garden waste service

From spring 2009, a new garden waste service is being introduced by Tandridge District Council to help residents compost their garden waste, instead of burying it in landfill sites.

Residents will be able to take out an annual subscription for a fortnightly service which will take grass cuttings, away hedge trimmings, leaves, plant prunings, weeds and old or used compost in a special bin.

Bins will be provided as part of the subscription, which is expected to cost around £40 a year. The new service, which will be carried out by Biffa Waste Services, will start in spring 2009.

Initially it will be available for up to 6,000 households in the Caterham, Oxted and Warlingham areas. These areas have been selected as this is where most of the current garden waste sacks are sold. Residents fill up these sacks with their garden waste, which is collected by Biffa and taken to landfill.

As part of the new service, Biffa will be taking the collected garden waste to a dedicated composting facility in Kent.

Chairman of the Community Services Committee, Councillor Glynis Whittle, said: "We are very excited about the new service. It will provide a much greener way for residents to recycle garden waste and will also reduce the amount of rubbish being sent to landfill. We have decided to offer a subscription service, because not all residents will want their garden waste collected, especially those who are already composting theirs."

More details about the service will be available after Christmas.
