#### New barriers at INDEPENDENT Kenley Airfield

Last month, metal crowd control barriers were erected around parts of the perimeter track at Kenley Airfield. Notices on the barriers state that they are to aid the safety of the public whilst gliding takes place in the field and that if they are successful the need for a fence will be negated. The airfield is widely used by walkers, joggers, dog walkers and cyclists from the area and is a conservation area within the Green Belt.

Portley Ward Parish Council-

are horrible. There is a need to ensure that leisure users of the airfield do not go too close to the glider launch equipment, but these 200 yard stretches of barrier are far longer than necessary. They look incongruous and spoil the openness of the airfield. This is a fence in all but name. If barriers are really needed, they must be much shorter and less intrusive."

On the 11th June, the London Borough of Croydon Planning Committee is due to consider a planning application by the Ministry of Defence for a permanent fence around the airfield perimeter track. We will inform readers of the outcome next


## School gets its marching orders!

## **Burtenshaw's** Beat

Friday, 26th June marks a special day for me as it was on that day in 1979, thirty years ago, that I joined Surrey Police as a constable. When I first walked the beat I wore a cape and carried a handbag that contained my truncheon, handcuffs and pocket book. Crimes when reported were either written or typed onto a double-sided form in triplicate, meaning you had to get the carbon paper the right way round and Tippex was in demand for those typing errors! I first drove the Ford Escort affectionately know as the 'Panda'. Then, when it became white with a stripe, the 'Jam Sandwich' and now we have the 'Battenbera' markings. Like vehicles, society has changed and so has policing. Our uniform and the equipment carried by officers have changed; the typewriter has gone with the advent of computers. Having served through these changes, I can honestly say that to date Surrev Police (Surrev Constabulary when I joined) has given me an eventful career. I spent my first sixteen years at Reigate, initially as a patrol officer, then community liaison officer and then child protection officer before moving to headquarters as the vulnerable persons co-ordinator.

This gave me not only county-wide experience but also overseas experience in Slovenia. I visited Slovenia five times assisting with the development of their procedures in investigating crimes involving victims of child abuse, domestic abuse and rape. In 2001 I moved to Epsom on my promotion to custody before becoming a patrol sergeant on response at North Surrey. In 2005 I returned to Reigate having been promoted to Inspector on the response team before taking up my present role here as the Neighbourhood Inspector for Tandridge.

I always wanted to join the police and it has not let me down. I have had fun, laughter and tears but importantly worked with tremendous people both internally and externally and today I work with a team who, like me, want to do their best.

In March, UK base rates hit 0.5%. At these rates it's no wonder some MPs are desperately trying to claim for second homes as they cannot get a decent return in the average high street bank.

Ask your bank what return you are getting, as often it is not clear or it is left out on statements, and challenge them to deliver. They need your money and there are still some good deals around of circa 4% if you search hard enough. Cash may no longer be king in terms of returns but at least it is at hand should it be needed in the short to medium term. Make sure you use your ISA allowances and place deposits in the name of the person paying the lowest rate of tax. For borrowers it's a little different as unless you have circa 25% to put down as a deposit most banks do not want to lend to you competitively. This makes it tricky for first time buyers unless you are fortunate enough to have a benefactor. House prices still seem to be heading a wee bit lower and probably will bottom out in the next year, but this is still good news for most people looking to trade up or get on the ladder in the first place. So are things all that bad? The stock market is in fact



some 30% off its lows but few people have picked up on this relatively 'good news as it seems more in tune with a recessionary outlook to focus on the negatives. This may be a time to drip some money into the market to average out your risk, as things should be a lot better in the next two to three years.

It looks therefore, that a low interest environment is here to stay for the next year or so. Maybe it is right that the days of easy money are over. What is certain is that there are opportunities around but it takes longer to find them. However, that can also be rewarding. After all we cannot all be MPs!




