
Sun shines on Remembrance Day parades

New Walk-In Centre at Caterham Dene

On Monday 3rd October a new walkin centre for minor injuries opened at the Dene Hospital in Church Road, Caterham-on-the-Hill. The 'Caterham Dene Walk-In Centre' is run by First Community Health and Care, a new social enterprise replacing the Eastern arm of the Surrey Primary Care Trust as part of the government's NHS reforms.

The centre is run by two Emergency Care Practitioners, Lisa Wood and Alison Williams who for the last five years managed the Urgent Treatment Centre at East Surrey Hospital.

Alison said: "This new unit means that local people will not have to go and wait for hours and hours at East Surrey Hospital. I know how long people have to wait so this is a much closer-to-home service. We can treat patients with minor head injuries, eye injuries, sprains and fractures and will send patients

with more serious injuries to East Surrey. We are in touch with the ambulance service so they can bring patients here instead of East Surrey Hospital when appropriate." The centre is currently open from 9am-5pm Monday-Friday and patients have to be over 16. As the centre becomes more busy and more staff are employed the centre will look into extending its opening hours. The Walk-In Centre can be contacted on 01883 837512.



Dunottar girls go behind the scenes at the Natural History Museum

Earlier this term 30 lucky schoolgirls from Dunottar Girls School in Reigate accompanied their biology teacher on a very special trip to the Natural History Museum in London. The girls went along to witness the donation of their teacher's collection of plants and butterflies made on an extraordinary expedition to the Arctic over 30 years ago. Head of Biology, Ms Pip Wood, had been the scientific officer on the Baf-Island Youth Expedition to Arctic Canada in 1978 when she was working at Therfield School in Leatherhead. Ms Wood, along with three other adults and seven 16-19 year-olds, had undergone nearly three years of training. The aim of the expedition was to climb peaks in a poorly mapped area of the island and undertake scientific projects.


Gruesome fun at **Church Walk Shopping Centre!**

Diary of a **Plantaholic**

by Sue Baines

Plant silhouettes, scent and berries become increasingly important both visually and to the wildlife at this time of year. I try to cram as much as possible into the top and front garden so that it cheers me up on even the gloomiest of days. Placing a few pots with flowering plants in prominent positions works well too, although the choice of flowers is very limited. Last year I found the bedding dianthus flowered as well as anything, and flowered again in summer. Little violas have already put on an excellent show but even they struggle in the depths of winter.

One of my most successful and favourite plantings has to be the window boxes opposite the front door in a very shady place. They contain skimmia reevesiana, gaultheria and evergreen ferns. They were planted into ericaceous soil about



five years ago. The lovely red berries look stunning against the deep green, and the ferny foliage sets it off a treat.

On a large scale is the sorbus 'pink pagoda', but any of the rowans look good for some time, and the birds were queuing up to eat the berries once the cold set in. I love the coloured barks too. Well known are the birches, but don't forget the dogwoods. These look a little drab through summer, but I like to grow a clematis through them, so they earn their place in summer and winter. Cornus 'midwinter fire' backlit by the sun is an unforgettable sight. These winter beauties make excellent presents. Happy Christmas and stay snug.





Marie Curie site: **Planning Application** TA/2011/1316 Independence Homes Ltd.

Independence Homes Limited, the owners of Harestone House in Harestone Valley Road, are not a registered charity but a Private Limited Company making profits and distributing dividends.

We, like most residents, welcome the idea of a new care home and accommodation for epileptics but not the size and mass of development proposed in five blocks, all of which significantly exceed the floor area and mass of existing buildings. As proposed it will be detrimental to close residents and to those with views across the Valley. It will result in at least 40% of the mature trees on the site being either removed or at risk of damage. The proposals do not follow the Concept Statement principles or the Harestone Valley Plan Policies.

Under the Concept Statement, if Harestone House is to be replaced, the new building should be restricted to the existing footprint, should avoid existing trees and should be of a similar scale and mass to the building being replaced. By following these principles not only would existing trees around the building be retained but the effect of the new building on residents would be minimised.

This number of apartments is not critical to the rationale for a care home on the site. Similarly it is difficult to understand the need for two five bed houses requiring the removal of mature TPO trees and displacing existing car parking close to residents. We would urge residents to oppose the proposals in their present form and seek with Independence Homes Limited to find proposals that respect and work within the Concept Statement and the Harestone Valley Plan.

The present proposals do not currently conform should be refused if Independence is not prepared to accept changes.
