Caterham will be joining names such as McLaren, Mercedes, Ferrari and Red Bull on the grid next season following the official change of the 'Team Lotus' racing team to the 'Caterham F1 Team' on Thursday, 15th December. For years the classic Caterham Seven car has been a well-known name amongst motoring enthusiasts but from next season the brand will also

become a household name for millions of F1 fans across the globe,

Andy Noble, Sales and Marketing Director at Caterham Cars, said: "The new Caterham F1 car is being launched at the end of January and the plan is to be fighting for points next year, which is something we couldn't hope for this year. Andy has been in discussions with the organisers of the Caterham Festival with regard to a possible Soap Box Race down Church Hill in Caterham as part of the Festival activities next summer with teams from local organisations invited to take part.

"It is just the gem of an idea at the moment," said Andy. "It would be a great way to showcase the design and technology departments of local schools as well as other F1 teams that may want to join in. Other towns have quirky events like the Gloucester Cheese Rolling, why not Caterham?

"Church Hill would be a fantastic track to do it on, nice and steep, but we would need the co-operation of the council and local people." Andy would like to know what members of the community think about the idea of a Soap Box Race and also their thoughts generally on Caterham Cars being in

town. The company's future in Caterham is uncertain as

the lease on their premises in Station Avenue is due to expire soon which means they may be forced to look for a new location for their showroom.

Action group fights development proposals for former hospice site

Residents bordering on the site of the former Marie Curie Hospice in Harestone Valley Road, Caterham Vallev have formed an action group to oppose the proposals by Independence Homes Limited for the site. The group has commissioned advice from London-based planning consultancy firm, Quod Planning, who have written a letter to Tandridge District Council ('TDC') expressing the group's concerns.

This follows the release by TDC of the details of the pre-contract discussions between CBP Architects for Independence Homes and the planning officers at TDC. The purpose of the group is to ask for the proposals in Planning Application TA/:2011/1316 to be refused and then provide a body for further, proper consultations on the site's redevelopment.

The proposals in the planning application are for the erection of an apartment building consisting of 15 two-bed and ten one-bed apartments, a 20-bed care home, three terraced houses, a pair of five-bedroom semi-detached houses and a two storey office building with parking. In a detailed letter sent to TDC dated 7th December, Quod Planning sets out the group's concerns and why the application should be refused. One of the main

areas of concern is the den-

sity of the proposed devel-

opment which the group believes should be reduced to preserve the character and distinctiveness of the area. Residents in properties that overlook the site are invited to join the action group and can contact Mike Smith at masmasonbrook@msn.com for more information.

Thieves steal memorial plaques from cemetery

Detectives are appealing for information from the community which will help them ensure justice is done after thieves stole more than 90 memorial plagues from St. Luke's Church in Whyteleafe Hill. The theft happened some time between 4am on Wednesday, 23rd November and 10am on Friday, 25th November.

Detective Constable Errol Chetty said: "At any time of year this offence could only be described as extremely distasteful, but as we approach Christmas, stealing memorial plaques from a church cemetery is truly heartless. I would urge everyone to work with us to identify and provide evidence so we can ensure those responsible are brought to justice. The price of metal is high at the moment which makes it an attractive commodity to thieves. This offence is disgraceful and we need your help."

"The local Safer Neighbourhood Team is working with colleagues in CID and together we will do all we can to remove those responsible from the streets. I urge members of the community to work with us so we can ensure grieving families are not further distressed." Norma Haimes, who has





My seed catalogues have been sitting in a drawer, waiting for the weather to change. I like to get my order in early, as there is always more choice. New favourites are: Browallia, a half-hardy



annual, with mid-blue Plumbago-like flowers. It was the first to start flowering and the last to finish, gorgeous. I was also pretty impressed by Alonsoa, both the scarlet, and the pink. Their dainty flowers resemble Diascia, but are a little taller. These will over-winter if kept frost-free.

My Datura (Brugmansia) has had to go into the conservatory. It had 32 flowers on it at the end of October. It is too big really, so I took eightinch-long cuttings and put them into a tall jam jar containing water only. This has been left in a propagator, but a warm windowsill would work just as well. Masses of roots are now showing.

Local film producer meets Prince Charles at film premiere

On Monday 21st November, Caterham Valley resident, David Larsen, was introduced to the Prince of Wales at a premiere of the World War II film 'Resistance' held in Abergavenny, South Wales.

The film, directed by Amit Guptar, stars Andrea Riseborough, Tom Wlaschiha and Michael Sheen and is about the lives of a small farming community in Wales that is occupied by the Nazis during World War II. Part fact, part fiction, the story, based on a novel by Owen Sheers, is a haunting depiction of how things may have been for communities across the land if D-Day had failed and the Germans succeeded in invading Britain.

'Resistance' is the first film that David Larsen has been involved in producing. He was originally asked to invest in the project and was then invited to join the board of the production company, Resistance Films Ltd as an independent, nonexecutive director.

"The story first appealed to me because it is set in South Wales where I come from," said David.

"We were thrilled when Prince Charles came to the premiere. We heard that he especially wanted to attend because he had read and

enjoyed the book." The film was shot in just five weeks in Abergavenny with David on the team to make sure things progressed properly.

"It was quite exciting for the local people," said David. "A number of them offered bed and breakfast to members of the cast and film crew, and they also appeared as extras in a fête scene that appears in the film. It was amazing to see it all come together with such a diverse bunch of people and it was hard not to get emotionally involved. To my mind, producers like Richard Holmes and Amanda Faber are our unsung heroes who probably don't get the recognition they deserve for their contribution to the economy." 'Resistance' has been screened at a limited number of cinemas including the Odeon in Panton Street, Leicester Square. Further screenings will be scheduled in accordance with public demand.




