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## **Local lottery launched** to save Soper Hall

The Soper Hall Community Centre, a registered charity, is giving people the chance to win up to £25,000 and help a good cause at the same time.

Soper Hall Community Centre has joined the Unity Lottery, which is already helping more than 250 charities raise money across the country and pays out thousands of pounds in prizes every week. People who play the lottery, which is run by Sterling Lotteries based in Barrow-in-Furness, Cumbria, pay £1 every week to receive a

unique six digit number, with 50p of that going towards the Soper Hall refurbishment fund.

A lottery draw takes place every week with prizes from £5 to £25,000 up for grabs. Although the charity will promote and market the lottery, Sterling is in charge of administering and running the scheme.

The Soper Hall Community Centre Ltd. was formed to oversee the asset transfer of the building from Tandridge District Council to the community. It is a company

open to any member of the community to join and help run. In its current format the 102 year-old building is unsustainable and a major refurbishment is required to create a modern, fit for purpose community centre that will serve the community of Caterham and Tandridge district for the next 100 years. This will require raising at least £5m to fulfil the Vision' 'Grand www.soperhall.org.uk).

Chairman of Soper Hall Community Centre Ltd., Graham Tapley, said: "By having our own, but professionally run, lottery we will be able to offer a unique opportunity for the community to show their financial support and at the same time



enjoy the experience of a potential lottery win. All funds raised this way will go in to the pot alongside other fund raising initiatives".

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#### **Council puts Rose** & Young firmly back on the agenda

Tandridge District Council ('TDC') formed a new Working Group recently to focus specifically on solving the problem of the derelict Rose & Young showroom in Croydon Road, Caterham.

On Tuesday 3rd December the Working Group, made up of local district councillors, hosted a meeting in the Soper Hall, Caterham. The meeting was held to discuss the way forward with members of the public and invite suggestions for future use of the building.

Amongst those present was the Head of Planning at TDC, Piers Mason, the Deputy Chairman of Surrey County Council, Sally Marks, Chris Windridge representing the CR3 Forum and Neighbourhood Plan, local architect Random Greenway and members of the Rose & Young Action Group made up of concerned local business owners who have been putting pressure on the council to sort out Rose & Young over the last four years. The Action Group has also explored various possible solutions over the years, including trying to find a developer to fund a Compulsory Purchase Order ('CPO') as TDC say they are not in a position to fund a CPO themselves.

At the opening of the meeting the Chairman of the TDC Working Group, Councillor Jane Ingham, said: "The object of tonight's meeting is to review progress to date and any other options for the site. We are very conscious that the site is in private ownership and that the owner has broken many promises."

According to Chris Windridge the Neighbourhood Plan could be the 'game changer' as it will produce a strategic plan for the

town centre with wide community engagement. The plan, he said, would give more leverage to the council to get the site redeveloped at last.

However, others at the meeting were less optimistic.

Local resident, John Harvey, said: "I am sick and tired of hearing Tandridge councillors say that the council does not have money to spend on compulsory purchase. If set up right a CPO can be a nice earner for a council. You just need the right people to do this."

After much discussion TDC Chairman, Beverley Connolly, summed up by saying: "What we do have in this town is a great community spirit. We are lucky in this town to have the

sort of people who come together to try and resolve local issues such as Rose & Young." Jane Ingham announced that the Working Group would report back to the Planning Policy Committee in March after they have collated information and spoken to other local groups. Afterwards, local businessman, Marc Hansen, a member

of the Rose & Young Action Group said: "TDC were not able to do anything in the past and it seems the new Working Group has no sense of urgency - we are simply stirring the same old pot."

I hope you all had a super Christmas, and are looking forward to the new gardening year. If, like me, you got lots of garden vouchers, you may be itching to spend them. Now is a very good time, but you do need to be discerning. Look at the bulbs - not just the packaging. Make sure they are plump, not dry, and shrivelled.

Lots of topiary and shrubs can be a bargain, but look carefully as to why it is cheap. Has it just been in its pot too long? Do you have the time, space and perfect place for it? Will it be too heavy once potted on? Will you have time to feed and nurture it? Or is it in the bargain section because it is diseased? Are there lots of notches round the leaf (possibly vine weevil), which may mean the grubs are eating the roots, and therefore best avoided?

even though Christmas is over. They are still a beautiful foliage plant with or without berries. They are slow growing, but once established, are very tolerant. The plain green are excellent for fairly dense shade, although you may get less berries if it's too shady. If berries are important, seek advice, as unfortunately you need both male and female in fairly close proximity. To make things more confusing, many female named plants are actually male!! Don't let this put you off though, as it is still a diverse, beautiful range, and well worth a place in every garden.

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




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#### **Budding law students from** Warlingham School go to court for the day

On Saturday 16th November a group of Warlingham School sixth form students headed off to Guildford Crown Court to participate in a charity-run event, the Bar National Mock Trials, run by the Citizenship Foundation. The charity run a variety of events to try and encourage and inspire young people in to participating in society and help them get a better understanding of the law, politics and democratic life. Each year around 2,000 students from Year 10 to Year 13 participate.

The group of Year 12 and 13 students spent several weeks preparing their roles for the trial. This year the school had a group of Year 12 students acting as jury and one student, Lucas Johncey, acting as court clerk. The rest of the students from Year 13 played several different roles including barristers, wit-

nesses and defendants. On the day of the trial the students had to participate in two court hearings before the judges decided which two schools would take part in the finals for the London region. The winning team would get the chance to go to Cardiff in March to take part in the finals with all the other regional winners.

The first two rounds were cases on fraud and assault, where the students would


be judged on their skills and contributions by the head judge at the front of the court. Warlingham's students had two very strong rounds which left them with a place in the finals for the London region. Unfortunately for the Warlingham students the other team from Tunbridge Wells Girls' Grammar School gained more points in the final and won overall, but it was a very close call.

Although Warlingham came extremely close to winning but ended with second place, the team was overjoyed with the outcome and the experience has only pushed them to work harder and improve.

#### Visit Bollywood -Caterham Valley's trendy hot spot!

The interior of Bollywood Indian Restaurant in Godstone Road, Caterham Valley, has had a makeover and the fresh colours and new lighting create an amazingly vibrant backdrop for a great night out. I visited recently with my friend Ann who lives in Sutton and has not been to Bollywood before. As soon as we sat down she remarked on the contemporary decor and modern feel to the restaurant. While we were deciding what to order, restaurant manager Khan told us proudly that the restaurant received a five star Food Hygiene Rating from Tandridge District Council recently, which is very hard to get.

The standard of the service and the cleanliness is certainly very high at Bollywood and the food was not about to disappoint us either. After sharing a couple of crispy Papadoms, Ann and I tucked in to our starters, the Prawn Puri for Ann and the Vegetable Samosas for me. The vegetarian starter made a very pleasant change for me and Ann's prawns, which she let me taste, were lovely - nice and spicy but not too hot.

For our main courses Ann chose one of the Chef's Specialities, the Stuffed Chicken Massala, stuffed with spices, tangy potatoes, onion and flaked almonds cooked in yoghurt.

I chose the Lamb Shaslik from the clay oven - tender pieces of lamb roasted on a skewer. We shared a portion of Coconut Rice and a portion of Sag Aloo (spinach and potatoes) and the quantity of food we had was more than enough. Ann's chicken was a very generous portion of meat and came with a medium hot sauce. On the menu it said that it is one of the most popular dishes and we could see why. The combination of the meat, the

stuffing and the spicy sauce was perfect and Ann said she thought the coconut rice went with it very well. My lamb kebab was also good, with the lamb pieces nice and tender. As it was the run-up to Christmas there were several groups of people out celebrating and Bollywood certainly has a great ambience for an extra special night out.

The food offers excellent value for money, especially on takeaways where they offer a 20% discount. To book a table or order a takeaway meal call the restaurant on 01883 349877.

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




