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Exciting times ahead for Caterham Town Centre and Caterham-on-the-Hill

On Thursday 22nd September, the Caterham Town Centre Working Group held a presentation on the 'Master Plan' to be created for the improvement of the town's two main retail areas, in Caterham Valley and Caterham-on-the-Hill. Cllr. Michael Cooper chaired the meeting that was attended by representatives from local Parish Councils, Tandridge District Council, The Caterham Community Partnership, Caterham School and the Caterham Business Improvement District ('BID'). The meeting was held to invite comments from those present about the issues affecting Caterham's main shopping areas, that were presented by town planning experts from Nexus Planning consultancy. The initial Master Plan is expected to be ready to go to public consultation in three months' time. Local residents will have the opportunity to express their views on how the Master Plan proposes to improve parking, retail sales, the night-time economy, the appearance of buildings and pedestrian access to shops.

One of the main areas of improvement will be the redevelopment of the derelict Rose & Young site in Croydon Road. Louise Round, the Chief Executive of Tandridge District Council, shared the good news that the council has served a Compulsory Purchase Order on the owner of the site in order to enable the plans to build a Premier Inn hotel and Beefeater restaurant to go ahead. However, if the owner objects to the CPO there will have to be a public inquiry and decision on the appeal by a government inspector. It was also announced at the meeting that the month-long ballot process had started for the implementation of the Caterham BID (Business Improvement District). If successfully introduced, the BID status will generate funds through a levy to spend on improving issues affecting local businesses such as waste collection and recycling. At the end of the meeting Cllr. Cooper thanked everyone for attending and for their valuable input to the draft Master Plan.

Local pets still under threat from cat killer

As many people are now aware, there have been a number of victims of the person killing cats and other animals including rabbits and foxes in the Greater London area and beyond, with suspected cases in St Albans, Northamptonshire, Manchester, Birmingham, Brighton and Maidstone. There was an increase in frequency during August, with cases in Warlingham, Sanderstead and Coulsdon. South Norwood Animal Rescue & Liberty (SNARL) are working with the police to identify the culprit. Until they are caught, SNARL advises that cat owners keep their cats indoors as much as they can and let them out only during the day when they can be supervised, and keep cats in at night. It will cut the risk to cats dramatically if they are kept indoors during the hours of darkness. Residents of Greater London are currently living in a very high risk area for these

killings. SNARL is asking people to report anyone spotted behaving oddly around cats, foxes or birds to the police via 101 with a full description of the person and what they are doing, and quote Operation Takahe (pronounced Takkahay). Where possible get vehicle registration details. Please then text the police or CAD reference number to 07957 830490 or 07961 030064.

In cases where someone is spotted catching a cat, fox or bird and causing harm to them please dial 999. If you find a mutilated animal call SNARL on 07961 030064 or 07957 830490 immediately. Please stay with the body if you can and prevent any council or waste services from touching or removing it and anyone from photographing it. To report any information about who might be committing these offences, call the team running Operation Takahe on 0208 6490216. All calls will be treated in the strictest of confidence. SNARL can also be contacted via Facebook: South Norwood Animal Rescue and Liberty - SNARL.

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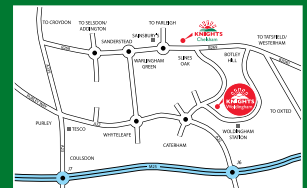

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Paul takes on challenge of a lifetime in memory of his son

On Saturday 24th September, Caterham resident, Paul Sims, completed a gruelling cycle ride from John O'Groats to Land's End to raise funds for the Polycystic Kidney Disease Charity (PKD).

Paul's baby son, Ezra, was diagnosed with PKD in utero when Paul's partner, Bonnie, had her five month scan. The scan showed that the disease was already at an aggressive stage and Ezra's tiny lungs and kidneys were fatally impaired. A week later, at just 21 weeks, Bonnie was induced and the couple embraced Ezra throughout an emotional blessing.

Joining Paul on the ride, that set off from John O'Groats on Sunday 11th September, was Paul's good friend Beau Ormrod, from Manchester. Unfortunately, Beau badly injured his knee in Carlisle, but as he had reached the half-way mark he was determined to finish the ride. Following doctor's orders, for the remainder of the ride Beau had to stop three times each day to apply an ice pack to his knee to keep it working.

After completing the ride, Paul said: "It is nice to have finished the ride but I am missing it in a strange kind of way. Your whole life is revolved around the preparation and planning and then we got used to the regular daily rou-

tine we were in during the ride. Lots of kind people gave us donations along the way, which restored our faith in human kindness. There was even a lady when we finished in Land's End who became quite emotional and gave us a donation because her family has been affected by PKD.

"Losing our son turned our world upside down and the support we received from staff at St. George's & East Surrey Hospitals and the Polycystic Kidney Disease Charity has been invaluable; it's important to me to show my appreciation and to support the organisation's work in any way that I can." Together with a £2,000 donation from Barclays Bank, where Paul and Beau work, the couple have raised over £5,000 so far for PKD.

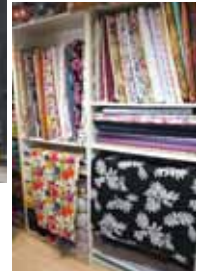

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Diary of a Plantaholic

Autumn hues are all around and stored bulbs are coming to life, but it has taken me a bit by surprise this year, as the summer has been so idyllic. I have been choosing next year's bulbs, which I like to have in prominent pots surrounding the house or front garden. The only problem is that not many pots are empty yet! This is fine for tulips, as they are best planted in October/November anyway, and even later if planted in the ground. I've added a few new favourites to my usual list of Tete a Tete daffodils, Red Riding Hood tulips and the lovely blue shades of Anemone Blanda. These include Scilla Peruviana, a bit tender in a bad winter, and a little expensive, but they are a gorgeous blue, and a very full flower, perfect for a pot. I also find the large Fritillaria Imperialis makes a good show too but not near the house, as it doesn't smell too good. For scent I rely on Thalia white daffodils, and Hyacinth, but there's lots of choice and

scent is even more welcome through the winter months. I have made a good start on collecting seeds from my favourite annuals. Some, like the poppies, have already been re-sown for next year, but I like to have a backup of any of the more unusual varieties. I try to collect later on a sunny day, so they are completely dry, and put them in paper, not plastic, envelopes. My cuttings are being taken first thing in the morning, especially if it's been hot. This means the stems are nice and firm at the tips and will give them the best chance. As we have the cold frames in a shady, sheltered spot, I have already prepared several trays with 9cm pots filled with a 50:50 mix of perlite, but grit would be fine.

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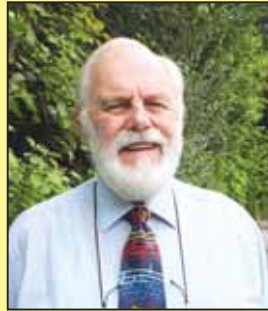

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Eating Out

Try the exciting new menu at The New Caterham Arms

The New Caterham Arms in Coulsdon Road, Caterham-on-the-Hill, has launched its new autumn menu, which I had the pleasure of reviewing recently with my friend Anne. The head chefs, brothers Omar and Adlan, devised the new menu that features a good selection of Starters and Main Courses that includes Rib Eye Steak, Fish and Chips, Hunters Chicken and Lamb Shank. It also includes a Pie of the Day, which was Pork and Apple on the day we visited. Restaurant manager, Lisa, told us that the other Pies of the Day are Beef and Guinness, Lamb and Mint, Beef and Mushroom, Chicken and Bacon and Chicken and Leek.

The menu also features Burgers, Burritos, Pasta & Pizza, Salads and Sandwiches, as well as a choice of three Sharing Platters, all expertly prepared using fresh ingredients. The home-made desserts offer favourites such as Sticky Toffee Pudding and Apple Crumble.

Anne chose the Tempura Prawns with sweet chilli dip for her starter and the Chicken Burritos, served with nachos and filled with mixed vegetables and cheese, for her main course. I chose the

Ciabatta, Olives, Hummus and Tzatziki for my starter then the Battered Haloumi served with chips and peas for my main course. When the food came up it looked very appetising. Anne said her Tempura Prawns were succulent, with the chilli sauce adding a nice little kick to them. I had a very generous serving of warm Ciabatta with lovely accompanying dips and big, juicy olives.

Our main courses were hot, very filling and delicious. It was the first time that Anne had eaten Burritos that were not taken home in a kit from the supermarket. She said the tortilla wrap was beautifully soft, brimming with the filling, and the crispy nachos were also home-made - she said there was "so much interest" on her plate! I was very happy with my Battered Haloumi, which was accompanied by a very tasty pesto and natural yoghurt dip. It was nice and filling, with three large chunks of haloumi along with the chips and peas.

The food, as well as the excellent wine list, is very reasonably-priced and offers good value for money. After our main courses we could not manage a dessert, so saved that pleasure for another time.

The visit was further enhanced by the wonderful service provided by Lisa, who was very knowledgeable about the various dishes and their ingredients.

The New Caterham Arms is a great local venue for lunch as well as dinner, as it opens at 12 noon daily. It has a very popular Sunday Carvery, with a selection of three roast meats for £10.95.

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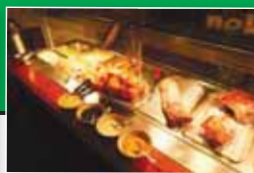


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Whyteleaf FC
