Councillors oppose a garden village in Chaldon

Chaldon residents have been expressing their surprise and anger that Green Belt land surrounding the ancient St. Peter and St. Paul Church has been identified as one of the sites under consideration for a "Garden Development" as part of the Local Plan.

On Thursday 16th March, Tandridge District Council's Planning Policy Committee agreed the Council's Preferred Strategy for development for the district up to 2033.

This supports the proposal for a garden village, of around

4,000 houses, which would require the release of around 1% of Green Belt land to be pursued as part of the Local Plan. The aim is to provide a mix of affordable and starter homes and would include new schools, a doctor's surgery, supermarket and investment in roads.

At this stage, the strategy does not set out in detail exactly where new development will take place, but sets out the principles on which decisions will be based. One of the sites put forward by landowners and developers to be considered is at Alderstead Heath and Tolsworth Farm in Chaldon, adjacent to the North Downs Way National Trail. The other four sites are at Blindley Heath, land west of Edenbridge, Redhill Aerodrome and South Godstone. Once locations which can be developed have been identified, further consultation will take place to ensure the final Local Plan caters for present and future needs.

Without looking at the Green Belt, the Council says it will only be able to deliver just over a third of the housing needed. This approach would not boost the supply of housing as required by the government and would not pass the

independent examination of the Local Plan, which could mean the Council losing the ability to control and plan for development in the district, putting more Green Belt at

Councillors oppose sultation and scrutiny of the a garden village in Chaldon

The land in Chaldon is one of a number of sites added to the Local Plan's Housing and Economic Land Availability Assessment ("HELAA") after the Local Plan consultation period ended on 30th December 2016.

Responding to the Chaldon site being one of the sites to be considered for the garden village, Chaldon Village Councillor, Bob Milton, said: "Chaldon Village Council has publically stated its willingness to work with Tandridge District Council ("TDC") on the Local Plan. We have put our faith in TDC to deliver a Local Plan that will meet the housing need for the district, but also protect and respect open and green spaces. This late, uninformed and arbitrary decision to include Chaldon land for consideration under the Local Plan has damaged the reputation of TDC and has raised doubts as to their commitment to full public conLocal Plan process.

Following the initial announcement of the proposal for a new garden village in February, Liberal Democrat District Councillor for Caterham-onthe-Hill, Chris Botten, said: "I welcome the recognition that our urban centres can take no more large scale development and that our infrastructure is creaking. I am pleased that the dangers of flooding due to poor planning and over development in Caterham have at last been recognised, as a result of fierce campaigning by residents. We desperately need clarity about the location of the "garden village", and I hope that the absurdity of locating it next to Chaldon means it will be ruled out quickly. That said, I believe the creation of a new residential settlement with schools, primary care and appropriate infrastructure is the right solution and that with careful planning, it will be seen that using up 1% of our Green Belt to save the rest is the best outcome for the district. We will, however, need to continue to fight to save Heath Road allotments and other valued open spaces and to ensure that planners fully understand the flood issue. We need huge investment in our infrastructure, and we need to fight to find the resources to fund that investment."

Before the vote to adopt the strategy for a new garden village, Clir. Botten proposed a Recommended Urban new Space Objective be included in the strategy to protect open spaces within urban areas. This proposal was agreed by members of the Planning Policy Committee who then voted in favour of the proposal for a garden village.

Following the vote, Councillor Peter Bond, Chairman of the Planning Policy Commit-tee, said: "We now have a clear strategy that will be reflected in the development of a Local Plan that is infrastructure-led and which relieves the pressure on existing facilities. Releasing a small amount of the Green Belt will enable us to deliver the infrastructure we so badly need, while protecting the rest from incremental development."

Caterham publishes its 'community vision' for the next 15 years

These two projects together will maximise the opportunities for Caterham's two town centres.

The Caterham Town Design Statement has taken information from over 400 surveys completed by residents and local businesses, plus questionnaires and information from de Stafford School pupils and attendees at the Douglas Brunton Centre. There have also been detailed working groups involving over 30 local people from all walks of life in workshops and meetings who have pulled peoples' vision together into this final statement.

Subjects covered range from retail and business, through to access and parking, public spaces, leisure, our heritage, character,

buildings and functionality. It is hoped this will ensure that the town will be as loved and valued in the future as it has been in the

Chris Windridge, Chair of the project, said: "It is fantastic to have had the opportunity to be involved in this meeting of minds from the whole Caterham community. It is very encouraging that TDC has been so supportive of the project, and we look forward to an ongoing collaboration. The momentum to bring Caterham to a well-deserved prosperous future has been kick-started at last, and I would like to thank everyone who has helped realise this over the last two years."

Louise Round, Chief Executive of TDC, said: "We welcome the publication of the Caterham Town Design Statement, an informative piece of work which the Council contributed some funding towards in order to capture the community's vision of how they would like to see their town evolve. It will feed into the creation of a Caterham Masterplan which will set out a vision for Caterham for the next 15 years and deliver improvements to the town's appearance and its retail and leisure offer."



Agencies meet to push forward plans to tackle flooding in Caterham

On Tuesday 21st March, a meeting was held in Caterhamon-the-Hill to plan flood risk management in Caterham and Old Coulsdon, following the devasting flood on Tuesday 6th June last year.

The floodwater from Caterham-on-the-Hill cascaded down on to Caterham Drive in Old Coulsdon, that already has poorly-maintained drains. causing serious cross-border flooding between Tandridge and Croydon. Therefore representatives from the planning departments of both Tandridge District Council as well as Croydon Council were present at the meeting. Surrey County Council, who is responsible for surface-water drainage and Thames Water who have responsibility for the sewers, as well as the Environment Agency, Caterham-on-the-Hill Parish Council, the National Flood Forum and the Old Coulsdon and Caterham-onthe-Hill Flood Action Groups all had representatives present at the meeting.

Following the meeting, Julie Blackman, Chair of the Old Coulsdon Flood Action Group, said: "I live in fear of rain because very little has been done to prevent a flood happening again. The flood was bad enough but the aftermath was even worse because we felt so let down but I think the various agencies are more aware of their responsibilities now and know that we, the Flood Action Groups, are not going to go away. It is good that they are talking to each other and doing some joined up thinking. I want all the flood victims, especially the elderly ones, to be reassured that we are still working to get some real action done to protect us from further flooding but it is a very slow process.

A spokesperson for Surrey County Council said: "We are working on a study to investigate the opportunities for managing flood risk in the catchment between Caterhamon-the-Hill and Old Coulsdon. This is a partnership project with other authorities including London Borough of Croydon, Environment Agency, Tandridge District Council and Thames Water. All of us have met with the Flood Action Groups to address the resi-

A statement from Croydon Council said: "The council is part of the official working and project group which has been set up to find long term solutions to the flooding in the Caterham catchment. We are committed to working closely with the Caterham and Old Coulsdon Flood Action Group, which is supported by the National Flood Forum."

Julie added: "It is essential that flooding is taken into account when developers put in planning applications. The National Planning Policy Framework says that a development cannot increase the risk of flooding elsewhere due to inadequate infrastructure. The problem affects everyone because insurance premiums will go up across the whole neighbourhood if our infrastructure is not fit for purpose."

Caterham celebrates launch of new Community Hub

Caterham Valley Library in Stafford Road is now a real Community Hub since the Citizens Advice Bureau has relocated to the newly-refurbished top floor. Also housed within the library building is the Caterham and District History Centre and the Caterham branch of the Tandridge Voluntary Service Council making it a real 'one stop shop' for Caterham.

On Thursday 9th March, Sally Marks, Chairman of Surrey County Council and also County Councillor for Caterham Valley performed the official opening of the new Hub, along with Peter Longhurst, the Chairman of Trustees for the Caterham CAB and representatives from other organisations.

CAB and representatives from other organisations. Sally Marks said: "This is the culmination of a long held dream to bring lots of local organisations together under one roof and I am so very privileged to be able to open this wonderful space and facility for our community."

F1 fans mourn loss of local racing driver, John Surtees

On Friday 10th March, motor racing legend, John Surtees CBE, from Lingfield, sadly passed away aged 83. John was the only man to be World Champion on two wheels and four, winning seven motorcycle World Championships as well as the F1 World Championship in 1964 driving for Ferrari, a feat which remains unmatched.

Caterham resident, Michael Hewitt, spent many years photographing the Monaco Grand Prix and met John Surtees on a number of occasions.

I explained that photographers were forbidden to stand where I had to take the photograph, but I obtained special permission to stand there for the first few laps of the Grand Prix.'



Residents angry at delay over new playground

Residents living in the Caterham Barracks development in Caterham-on-the-Hill are still waiting for their playground to be refurbished, nearly two years after launching their "Save Our Playground" campaign in 2015.

Over the years the playground close to The Arc arts and recreation centre has fallen into ruin, with rotten broken swings, fences, splintered see-saws and torn flooring presenting a danger to children and an evesore in the centre of the community.

Last November the residents were delighted to learn that an agreement had finally been reached for Linden Homes to hand the freehold, and Caterham Barracks Communty Trust ("CBCT") to simultaneously hand the leasehold, of the land over to Tandridge District Council. However, the transfers have not yet taken place, so the playground is still unfit for local children to enjoy.

Paul Pozzoni of the Village Association ("VA"), that represents local residents, said: "CBCT have introduced wholly new conditions which are unacceptable to the VA. We have made repeated requests for a meeting to try and unlock this impasse. The VA is very disappointed that the simple issue of repairing a children's playground is proving impossible to achieve within any reasonable timescale." Chris Botten, Chairman of Caterham-on-the-Hill Parish Council, which will fund the refurbishment, said: Council Parish remains deeply frustrated that there has been no progress on the transfer of the leasehold of The Arc playground, so that refurbishment can commence. Linden Homes are ready to transfer the freehold for this land simultaneously with the transfer of the leasehold from CBCT, which it was hoped would take place ready for the re-opening of the playground this spring. That clearly won't happen now, and we fear that the playground is being used as a hostage to other issues. We respect the fact that there are complications, that some matters are confidential, and we attribute no blame to any party for the delay. However, as it is, despite the recent removal of a dangerous dead tree, the playground remains unsafe and we call upon CBCT to agree the transfer of the leasehold to Tandridge District Council immediately, in order to allow the refurbishment to begin. We have reserved a large sum of public money for this project and are keen to see progress." Dick Moran, the Chief Exec-

utive of CBCT, said: "The Trust has been willing from before May 2016 to transfer the play area to the Council (either Tandridge or Caterham Hill Parish) and is disappointed it has not yet

happened. The mediation which was proposed by the Trust to resolve outstanding difficulties between the Trust, the Village Association, Linden (the developer of the Barracks) and the Council, set out the terms. "To transfer the property, as agreed at mediation, the Trust needed to be the freehold owner of the play area. The Trust's solicitor advised that some of the elements agreed at the mediation needed to meet legal requirements, includdocumentation required by the Charity Commission. As a charity, the Trust has to meet standards which are much

more demanding than normal property transactions. The transfer has been held up by legal issues and progress has not been helped by the Village Association withdrawing its solicitors. It has taken pressure from the District Council's solicitor to get close to an agreement and the Trust is hopeful that it will happen shortly."

In their quote on the current situation, a spokesperson from Linden Homes South East said: "We are working closely with other partners involved to ensure the Caterham Barracks playground is managed effectively to provide a safe play area for local children to use."

For over 30 years, Rotary worldwide and its members have been committed to fighting to eradicate polio across the world. The amount of polio-endemic countries has dropped from 125 to just three (Nigeria, Pakistan and Afghanistan), with over 2.5 billion children receiving vaccinations thanks to the help of Rotary.

Diary of a Plantaholic

A walk down the garden can take ages - it's a wonderful time of year, but busy. Seed sowing is in full swing. Lots of seeds take barely a week to pop up and grow more strongly than if planted too early. I do have to keep an eye on temperatures, as they can soar very quickly and plunge too (often in the same day!). Little and often and, as I always say, "a job in time saves 99!!".

My dahlias are being potted up. Some are quite large as they are over five years old now. Often the larger ones will divide themselves, but if they don't, I just leave it as a large tuber. It will probably be the end of April before I take off the bags of manure over those that are in the ground. They were put over as winter protection last autumn. This means the manure is already in situ for hungry dahlias. Any surplus goes to nearby roses.

Talking of roses, I have heard

that chopped up banana skins are a good source of food. I can't yet recommend it, but will definitely be giving it a go.

I have already used nematodes in the conservatory, and any time now will use them on other potted plants around the garden. Vine weevil grubs can quietly decimate plants over winter. Now the soil should be warm enough for the nematodes to be active. Having lots of plants, I disperse nematodes through a feeder fixed to the hose. Whilst the hose and feeder are out, I like to feed the spring bulbs too, and any struggling border plants. I am careful not to overdo it, as overly lush growth encourages greenfly. It is not just the plants that are on the move!

Discover Indian Fusion cuisine at Shahebs

A new Indian restaurant called Shahebs has opened at 55-57 Croydon Road, Caterham recently, serving traditional Bangladeshi favourites as well as "Indian Fusion" cuisine, meaning plated food with a modern twist, including South Indian food.

I visited the restaurant recently with my friend Anne. As we browsed the menu, Shaheb, the owner of the restaurant, was telling us that in April they will be introducing an Indian Tapas menu which will be available to order in the bar lounge adiacent to the main restaurant area. He said that families with children are very welcome in the comfortable bar, as well as in the restaurant. They will also be launching a three-course Sunday Roast in April, complete with roast potatoes, homemade Yorkshire pudding, buttered vegetables and gravy, but with

an Indian twist. Shaheb's experienced chef, Vijay, has worked in many restaurants, including Chinese and Italian as well as Indian restaurants. For our meal Anne ordered Lamb Chop Pativala that had been marinated with spices in a clay oven for her starter and I ordered the Ragda Pattie, a potato pattie served with chick peas in a tamarind and mint sauce. For our mains, Anne ordered the Meen Moilee, a South Indian dish of Sea Bass in a coconut, ginger and Indian-style Moilee sauce, topped with seaweed from Israel, and I ordered the Vegetable Biryani, which was cooked in the oven with a Roti bread lid, to keep in the steam, served with a vegetable curry.

We had vegetable sides of Brinjal Bhaji - strips of aubergine which is grilled and then crushed and cooked with garlic, ginger and onion, and Kadai Methi Paneer, a tasty dish featuring cottage cheese as the main ingredient.

Our meals were lovely, and Anne was especially impressed with the wonderful texture of her South Indianstyle Sea Bass, which Shaheb said was a favourite with


