## **Council withdraws Compulsory Purchase Order** on Rose & Young eyesore

Tandridge District Council housing. The Council has ("TDC") has decided to withdraw the Compulsory Purchase Order ("CPO") issued for the former Rose and Young site in Croydon Road, Caterham.

The Council is confident the cant work to demonstrate owner and Clarion Housing Group ("CHG") are close to exchanging contracts. CHG is a company committed providing affordable to

granted permission for 48 units, with a supermarket on the ground floor. Substantial progress has been made by CHG to buy the site, together with signifitheir scheme for affordable housing and a supermarket can be delivered.

The Council is keen to avoid the costs involved in

preparing for the Public Inquiry which considers the CPO. The Council is also keen to avoid the delays which could be caused by going ahead with the Inquiry, such as waiting for the decision of the Secretary of State and the potential of a legal challenge.

However the Council will be monitoring the progress of this scheme carefully and is still committed to securing the redevelopment of the site.

### Kenley Flypast marks 60th anniversary of the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight

On Sunday 20th August, a Mark 19 Spitfire performed a triple flypast over Kenley Airfield, descending to as low as 300 feet and thrilling the hundreds of spectators attending the event.

The Battle of Britain Memorial Flight ("BBMF"), now in its 60th year, normally features a Spitfire, Hurricane and Lancaster but this year nearly all of the BBMF fleet have been grounded due to an issue with their Merlin engines. However, the Officer in Command of the BBMF, Squadron Leader Andy Millikin, did not want to let people down, especially in this anniversary year, and personally flew the Mark 19 Spitfire with a Rolls-Royce Griffon engine, over Kenley. Known as the "Ferrari" of Spitfires, the Mark 19 can fly at 550 mph and climb to 41,000 feet.

After the flypast, local BBMF Co-ordinator, Mike Street, said: "I thought it was



### Council withdraws CPO on Rose & Young eyesore

If progress is too slow, the Council says it will take any action needed to ensure redevelopment takes place, including using another compulsory purchase order.

Councillor Martin Fisher, Leader of the Council, said: "We are confident at this stage that use of compulsory purchase would be unnecessary, given the progress made by prospective purchasers. The use of the CPO process to date has assisted in delivering our aims of securing redevelopment of this important town centre site. We will continue to consider the use of a CPO to secure the redevelopment of this site should it again become necessary." On learning of the withdrawal of the CPO, Caterham resident and retired property lawyer, John Harvey, said: "TDC's statement that "CHG are close to exchanging contracts" is no more or less than admission that any deal is still out in the bush. In view of the history of failed developments, I am very uncomfortable with TDC regarding this as a suitable basis for abandoning the greater certainty of a confirmed CPO.

"This decision will go beyond Rose and Young. TDC has admitted in minutes and agenda that the Caterham Masterplan will require compulsory purchase and what investor is now going to rely on our council delivering this?"

On a more positive note, Chairman of the Caterham Town Centre Working

Group, Cllr. Michael Cooper, said: "The idea of coming up with a CPO was to force action to do something about the derelict Rose and Young site. In that sense the CPO has worked in terms of turning the site from an eyesore into something for the benefit of Caterham. The reason it has been withdrawn is because the owner of the site is on the verge of selling to a firm that is committed to building flats with a retail outlet on the ground floor. "I am disappointed we have not been able to pursue the CPO because I think a hotel is what Caterham needs instead of flats and a retail unit. I understand there is much cynicism about the withdrawal of the CPO and I, too, am holding my breath!"

Local business owner, Andrew Browne of JJ Browne Jewellers, said: "I am very disappointed in TDC's decision to cancel the CPO at this very late stage. I am cynical about the current owner's plans to proceed to a development taking place, as we have been in this situation before and nothing came to fruition. I, along with several other applicants who had applied to speak at the public inquiry due to start in under two weeks, have spent time preparing our documents for the inquiry. "I appreciate that TDC have said that they will be monitoring the situation weekly and I hope that this development does happen as I, along with thousands of local residents and businesses, would be delighted that a development finally happens on this site." The Caterham and District Independent will keep readers posted with further developments.







### Excellent GCSE results for de Stafford students

Despite well-publicised reforms to the qualifications system, students at de Stafford are celebrating an outstanding set of GCSE results. New, harder content was included in the English and Maths specifications this year, yet 66% of students achieved the key threshold measure of 9-4 grades (equivalent to  $A^*$ -C) in both these core subjects. 

The Royal Tandoori Fine Indian Takeaway at 169 Coulsdon Road, Caterham-on-the-Hill, has had a smart, new makeover and certainly stands out from the crowd in its location opposite Tesco. There is plenty of parking nearby, with free spaces in Coulsdon Road and in the Tesco car park.

My daughters, Jenny and Claire and I had a takeaway from Royal Tandoori recently, as a treat while Claire was visiting from her home in Scotland. It was lovely to have a catch-up over a bottle of wine and a tasty, freshly-cooked Indian meal, saving me having to spend precious time in the kitchen.

For our starters, I had the Paneer Tikka, Jenny chose the King Prawn Butterfly and Claire chose the Lamb Tikka. Mine was a very tasty, vegetarian choice, with plenty of paneer (marinated chunks of cottage cheese) served with red and green peppers. Jenny's King Prawn Butterfly looked impressive and she said it was nice and juicy. Claire said her Lamb Tikka was filling, but she still

For our main courses I chose a Vegetarian Speciality, a

We shared a portion of Bombay Aloo (spiced potatoes), Onion Bhaji, Pilau Rice and a Peshwari Naan and Garlic Naan to accompany our meals. The quantity we ordered was plenty, with a little left over to save for the next day.

Jenny said that she was pleased she had tried something different, as she had never heard of a "Rezala" before. It was cooked with red and green peppers, green beans, onion and a very tasty, spicy sauce. She said she was also impressed with how light and fluffy the Naan bread was. 


