Council draws up plans to relocate Warlingham Village School

A proposal is being drawn up by Surrey County Council to expand and relocate high-performing Warlingham Village Primary School to create 210 more school places.

The school, which has an Ofsted "outstanding" rating, would be rebuilt nearby at Greenacres on the Limpsfield Road at a reduced cost to tax payers, under plans to help meet growing demand for school places in the Warlingham area. Greenacres is identified in Tandridge District Council's Draft Local Plan as a potential site for

development. However, as the Local Plan is only at draft stage, any planning application for a school on the site would need to demonstrate very special circumstances as it is on Green Belt land.

This proposal, being drawn up in conjunction with local developer Asprey Homes, would also involve providing new homes near the planned new school, which would help fund the school development. The school's existing site would be retained by the County Council, which would work with Tandridge

District Council to ascertain the best use of it for the local area.

Mary Lewis, Surrey County Council's Cabinet Member for Education, said: "Thousands more school places will be needed across Surrey over the coming years to meet demand from a growing population and this proposal offers the potential to help us create the places we need in Warlingham. The plans are at an early stage, but could mean a brand new school with plenty of outside space for Warlingham Village Primary pupils, enabling more children to go there - all at significantly reduced cost to Surrey taxpayers."

Stuart Mitchenall, chair of the school strategy board for Warlingham Village School, said: "The governors of the school and representatives from the GLF Schools Multi-Academy Trust are in dialogue with officers from Surrey County Council regarding the additional demand for places in the Tandridge area. We are keen to explore the options available and would ensure any solution maintains the quality of provision we currently offer at Warlingham Village. We place a high value on the role our school plays within the local village community and are committed to retaining this. We would aim to work together to ensure the enhanced facilities retain the existing advantages the school offers.'

Local Parish Councillor for Warlingham East and Tandridge District Councillor for Warlingham East and Chelsham & Farleigh, Jeremy

Pursehouse, said: "I can understand why those protesting at the move would do so. The communication from Surrey County Council on this scheme has been nothing short of pathetic. The residents of Warlingham have been bounced by this plan. I can also understand their affection for the building and I would like to see it preserved in some way. However, while there are still a lot more details to be revealed and agreed, I have to say that I support the plan in principle. If we must lose Green Belt land, I would rather it went to a new school building than anything else. The existing school is too small and badly laid out for modern needs and has no adjacent playing fields. The new school will provide places for more Warlingham children. My heart is with the protesters, but my head supports the move."

A planning application is expected to be made to Tandridge District Council later this year. There would need to be a public consultation and approval from the Secretary of State for Education before any move to expand or relocate the school could go ahead.



- Meeting the specific needs of vulnerable households and those on lower incomes.

Councillor Nick Childs, Chair of the Housing Committee, said: "Many people in our area cannot afford to buy their own home or rent a property. Our housing vision is to improve the quality of our residents' lives and wellbeing by delivering more high quality homes and maximising our ability to help those who need it. We are already building council homes and provide information and support to prevent homelessness, but this is not enough. We know we can't overcome all the challenges we face on our own, so we will work with our partners across all sectors to deliver the homes, including affordable homes, to give all our residents an opportunity to achieve a good quality of life in our district."


1st Warlingham celebrates opening of new Cub Pack

Diary of a Plantaholic

by Sue Baines

September saw Geoff finishing the paving around the top pond, as it was too hot to do heavy work during the summer. Initially it looked very stark, but so much safer. The paving doesn't disturb the existing clematis or lovely pink rose that drapes itself over the fence, flowering profusely next door!

Already there were a couple of evergreen Harts Tongue ferns underneath, so I will plant another couple to soften the edge of the paving. I was debating whether to plant a few bulbs, originally thinking of my favourite Tête-à-tête daffodils and Little Red Riding Hood tulips. However, I'll lovely the plant blue Anemone Blanda instead. They don't like to be disturbed and should look wonderful against the reasonably fresh foliage of the ferns in spring. I can always cut off winter ravaged foliage. Also the ferns don't have leaves to blow into the pond (although it will be netted).

Instead I'll plant a few bulbs in ordinary garden pots which

I can drop into pot covers as they come into flower, meaning they won't need to go on "feet". The pots will be tucked in next to a few evergreen plants of varying heights like the dark Pittasporum, Tom Thumb and various Heuchera/Heucherellas, plus a few spiky grasses. Currently the starkness is being filled by Begonias, which have been absolutely fabulous. They have had their vine weevil nematodes, as have the Heuchera (vine weevil favourites as they supply plenty of winter food for the grubs).

Dahlias are being planted out from their 30 litre pots, although not the main borders which are so floriferous they haven't been dismantled yet. I can't quite say goodbye to this summer....


